It's "budget release" week!

Buoyed by another positive revenue forecast on February 16, lawmakers began releasing their budgets last week. It started last Thursday with the Senate 2022 supplemental capital budget, continued on Sunday with the Senate 2022 supplemental transportation budget, and culminated with releases of 2022 supplemental operating, capital and transportation budgets today (Monday, February 21).

Bills that didn't make it

The Legislature is continuing to winnow bills as we enter the final three weeks of session. Here's the bill that failed to meet the 5:00 PM cutoff on February 15:

 HB 1802 would have added certain membership requirements for any statutorily created or mandated task force, work group, advisory committee, or other entity that is tasked with examining policies and issues directly related to people with disabilities.

What we're watching this week

- <u>SHB 1590</u> is scheduled for a public hearing in Senate Ways & Means February 22. The bill was stripped of the enrollment stabilization aspects, which are being handled in the budget; it still includes stabilizing enrichment levies and LEA for calendar years 2023 and 2024.
- <u>2SHB 1664</u> is also scheduled for a public hearing on February 22 in the Senate budget committee. As reported last week, the Senate ratios would begin phasing in all four categories of staffing in the 2022-23 school year.
- Making transportation enhancements for certain categories of students, <u>HB 1808</u> passed the
 House last month and was referred to the Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education Committee.
 It will not receive a hearing. Rather, <u>SSB 5581</u> looks to be the vehicle; it is in the House
 Appropriations Committee but hasn't been scheduled for a vote at this time.
- <u>E2SHB 1162</u> would create another pathway to graduation, called the performance exhibition.
 The bill is scheduled for a public hearing in the Senate education committee Monday, February 21 at 1:30 PM.
- <u>ESHB 1699</u> dubbed the retire/rehire bill, was scheduled for executive action in the Senate Ways & Means Committee for February 22 but was removed from the list. We are asking why.
- <u>E2SHB 1153</u> directs OSPI to implement a Language Access Technical Assistance program, subject
 to state funding, and requires school districts, starting in the 2022-23 school year, to collect data
 on language access and language access services and implement language access programs to
 meet stated requirements. The bill had a public hearing last week in the Senate education



- committee. It was amended in committee to start with the 2023-24 school year and to exclude school districts with fewer than 1,000 students and less than 10% ELL students.
- <u>HB 1973</u> would require all school districts to record school board meetings where action is taken, and public comments are offered. During the public hearing, a request from a school district superintendent was made to make this voluntary, as is the practice in city and council public sessions, or to at least make it voluntary for any district not already recording or live-streaming or posting their board meetings. The bill hasn't been scheduled for a vote yet.
- ESSB 5878 would make changes to arts instruction in grades K-12, starting in the 2023-24 school year. Doing a deeper dive into the bill, it would require districts to only use certificated arts educators or an employee of the district with an arts endorsement, which could be an issue in smaller districts with shortages in core subjects. However, a more challenging aspect for elementary schools is prohibiting the arts course from being incorporated into existing courses and requiring it to occur within the school day, with arts instruction time equal to instruction time devoted to other core subject areas. The bill had a public hearing in House Education on February 18 and is scheduled for a vote on February 22 or 23.
- <u>SSB 5933</u> passed the Senate 49-0 and has been referred to the House Capital Budget Committee. The bill would establish a school seismic safety grant program for school districts and state tribal compact schools for remediation of seismic or tsunami hazards in qualifying buildings. It is scheduled for a public hearing on Friday, February 25.
- HB 1611 would require universal screening for students to participate in the Highly Capable program; the bill had a strong public hearing last week but has been scheduled for a vote February 23.
- Scheduled for a Monday vote is <u>SHB 1759</u> which would require safe storage of firearms and medications. The bill was heard in the Senate education committee last week.
- Speaking of gun violence, we'll be watching to see how the House handles <u>ESSB 5078</u> (high capacity magazines), which passed out of the Civil Rights & Judiciary Committee last Friday but hasn't posted a vote count yet; and <u>ESHB 1705</u>, untraceable or "ghost" guns, which has a public hearing in the Senate Law & Justice Committee on Monday, February 21.
- <u>E2SHB 1723</u> is Rep. Mia Gregerson's bill to increase digital equity. The bill has a public hearing on February 23, and is scheduled for a vote on February 24, in Senate Environment, Energy & Technology.

Advocacy in Action

- Advocacy Committee member Melissa Stone was scheduled to speak in favor of SB 5078, high capacity magazines, but the session ran out of time.
- Past WSPTA President Michelle Nims spoke in favor of SHB 1759, a bill that would promote sharing information about secure storage of firearms and medications. Listen to Michelle's testimony here.
