Surrender its books, records, assets and property to the WSPTA office. 2. No longer use any name that implies or connotes association with National PTA or WSPTA. 3. Carry out promptly, under the direction of WSPTA, all proceedings necessary for the purpose of disaffiliating the local PTA or council.
Rationale for proposed change:	Last year, membership voted to amend the bylaws to remove the requirement that a PTA return PTA-branded materials when disaffiliating in Section 3 of this Article. Removing this statement from Section 2 brings consistency and completeness.

In the case of revocation of its charter by WSPTA, each local PTA and council shall: 1. No longer use any name that implies or connotes association with National PTA or WSPTA. 2.
