Planning for School in Fall 2020

With input from families, students, staff, and state and local health authorities, school districts must design either Plan A OR Plan B for returning to school, AND Plan C if it is not safe for large groups to be together or school buildings must close.

PLAN A

Full-time in-person learning at school for all students

Preferred IF physical distancing and in-person health requirements can be met



PLAN B

In-person learning at school, but in shifts, rotations or on a phased-in schedule, with remote learning options

Used if schools are unable to meet physical distancing or other in-person health requirements for all students









REQUIREMENTS for both Plan A and Plan B

Physical distancing when seated and as much as possible on buses





Health screenings, face coverings (masks/shields), frequent hand washing



Other Considerations for Plan A and Plan B

Drop off and pick up







Grouping Students



Cleaning and disinfecting Ventilation
















Used if it is not safe for large groups to be together or if school buildings must close **Washington State**
