I joke that I made eye contact with too many people. This is how my PTA life began in earnest. I kept asking questions. Why do the bonds fail? How is education funded in WA? How do we retain teachers? How do we support diversity in education? Why PTA? I still have so many questions. I continue to grow and learn and hope to the rest of my life. A good PTA leader will channel this enthusiasm. I have benefitted greatly from knowing and being mentored by many over my years in PTA. "You sound like you'd like to be more involved in the bond and levy effort. We could really use someone to help educate our members on what's going on and organize activities for our community to help," the leader said. "Yes," I replied excitedly. The rest is history.

Being involved in PTA started with supporting my children's local school PTA and classrooms. I found a calling in education advocacy. Over the years, my PTA work has expanded beyond the local level to include serving on the LWPTSA Council, Region 2 Service Delivery Team, and Washington State PTA committees.
