# Leadership Service Award Information



#### **Application Information:**

- Complete the online application form and submit by March 12, 2026
- Applicants must create an account to apply. New users set up an account; returning users log in with their email to continue without re-entering past information. For login issues, contact support@wastatepta.org.
- You must be a **current PTA member** to participate.
- You must hold a **leadership position for at least 8 months** to receive credit.
- If you hold the same position or attend the same training course in different years, record each year separately on the application so you receive credit for every year of service or training
- Provide the PTA name/number for your role: WSPTA (state), Region # (region), or local PTA/council.
- Attending a PTA training or event counts once; individual sessions within the event do
  not earn extra points. Exception: PTA and the Law taken at convention, WSPTA event,
  or region conference may be claimed.
- Only trainings provided or hosted by PTA are eligible for points; outside training does not qualify.
- You may take unlimited years to advance through award levels. Count points only from the **past five years.** If you earned an award in that window, add new activities since your last application; do not reenter previously credited role.

Bronze	Recognizes strong local leaders who are well trained and deeply engaged in their PTA community.	75 points +WSPTA Convention+ PTA & the Law
Silver	Honors leaders with broader impact, serving at council or state levels and advancing PTA advocacy.	Bronze Award + 150 points+ Advocacy event (ex. Leg Assembly or Focus Day) + Council/Region role
Gold	Celebrates leaders who mentor others and contribute significantly at council, region, or state levels.	Silver Award + 300 points+ WSPTA Standards presentation+ Leadership Conference
Crystal	Distinguished leaders who demonstrate statewide influence, advocacy, and mentorship across communities.	Gold Award + 400 points+ WSPTA committee+  ¹Advocacy with decision maker

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>Advocacy must involve a speaking/lead role with a decision maker (school board, council, legislator, etc.) on a member-approved WSPTA issue, resolution, or principle. Acceptable formats include testimony, presentation, or meeting/town hall/coffee chat. Provide topic, date, and decision maker name(s).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> In a given PTA year, officers and board members with more than one position on a board of directors for the same local PTA or council can claim points for only one of those positions. For example, serving as treasurer and another board position for the same PTA would receive points for being the elected officer (treasurer), not executive committee plus board member points.



<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> In a given PTA year, executive committee and board members may claim a maximum of 3 committee chair positions for non-board chair positions held for the same PTA.
